

Will American Airlines compensate me for a cancelled flight? ((AA_Compensation))

Yes, **American Airlines** may compensate you for a cancelled flight, but the eligibility and type of compensation depend on the **reason for the cancellation** and the applicable regulations **+1-(855)-(838)-(4706)**. If your flight is cancelled due to reasons within the airline's control—such as mechanical problems or crew issues—you may be entitled to compensation, rebooking, meal vouchers, or hotel accommodations if you are stranded overnight **+1-(855)-(838)-(4706)**.

For international flights, **EU Regulation 261/2004** may apply if your itinerary includes a departure from the EU or is operated by an EU carrier; this can entitle you to cash compensation of **€250–€600**, depending on flight distance and delay length, unless the cancellation was due to extraordinary circumstances **+1-(855)-(838)-(4706)**.

If you booked with **AAdvantage miles** and your flight is cancelled, your miles and any fees paid will be refunded without penalty **+1-(855)-(838)-(4706)**.

In short, AA will either **rebook you, refund your fare, or offer other assistance**, and in some cases—especially for controllable cancellations—you may also receive **compensation or amenities** **+1-(855)-(838)-(4706)**.
